

BUSINESS TROUBLES.

John A. Walter, grocer, Berlin, has failed for \$1,000.

Bell & Co., dry goods, Truro, N. S., have failed for \$2,500.

J. R. Clonis hardware, Galt, has assigned. He owes \$2,500.

J. B. Meloche, trader, Paspébiac, has assigned to Kent & Turcotte.

Charland & La Haise, furniture, city recently held a meeting of its creditors.

Moses J. Dickie, commission number, Bracebridge, has assigned to John C. Davidson.

J. Blais, jr., hotel, Buckingham, has assigned on the demand of Ang. Loddane. Liabilities \$1,500.

Ed. Jordan, jewellery and books and shoes, Chatham, is endeavoring to compromise at 50¢ on the dollar.

H. et al. Roux, general store, St. Jean de Dieu, has assigned to Parades & Jobin, Quebec. Liabilities \$3,500.

W. T. Hany, boots and shoes, Shelburne, Ont., who recently assigned has submitted an offer of 50 per cent. He owes \$2,500.

J. McPherson & Co., manufacturers boots and shoes, Hamilton, are also mentioned, have made an assignment to C. S. Scott.

L. Valer, saloon, city, has submitted an offer of 50¢ on the dollar, which has not been accepted, and the business will likely be sold out.

Sinclair Bros., general store, Cartier, Ont., are offering creditors 5¢ on the dollar cash, liabilities \$2,900. They were recently burnt out.

Giese & Graves, engravers, London, have assigned for \$2,000. Another small failure is that of N. Richardson, grocer, Cornwall, who owes \$800.

Chas. Brain, grocer, Huntsville, is endeavoring to compromise with his creditors. Liabilities \$3,300, assets \$1,500. W. A. Ross, tailor, Fergus, wishes to settle at 25 per cent on debts of \$750.

John Muldown & Co., wholesale woollens and tailors' trimmings, Toronto, are in difficulties owing chiefly to oversocking. The firm is said to have a stock on hand valued at \$2,000, and claims a surplus of upwards of \$20,000. John Muldown, the only partner was formerly of the firm of McMaster & Co., wholesale dry goods, but retired in February '95 and started for himself with a fair capital.

Alphonse Labelle, of Sault aux Recollets, has assigned on the demand of Joseph H. Mallette. The assets are the stock in trade of wines, liquors, cigars, fixtures and book debts. Added to these are two lots of land in St. Laurent Village. The liabilities are about \$3,000. The largest creditor are A. E. Mallette, \$224; J. H. Mallette, \$315; Laporte, Martin & Co., \$217; Bourassa Bros., \$200; Davies & Co., \$202, and G. Martel, \$219.

A demand of assignment has been made on P. Dunscean, carriage maker, city, at the instance of Fawcett & Fils. It is stated his liabilities amount to \$40,000. He has been in business a number of years and patented an axle on which he spent money. For a time J. S. Bousquet of the Peoples Bank was a special partner for him. He owned fine premises on Craig street, but they are heavily mortgaged and his interest as joint must have eaten up much of his profits.

J. Wilson & Co., have made a demand of assignment on Thomas Kearne, grocer. His assets are his stock of groceries and liquors at Jules street, a horse and wagon and book debts. The principal creditors are Bell, Simpson & Co., \$173; Caverhill, Hughes & Co., \$819; Hyatt & Hunter, \$214; Hudon, Hebert & Co., \$742; N. Quintal & Co., \$388; J. Whelan & Co., Daniel Keane, \$616, and Dame Elizabeth O'Daniel (Mrs. Thomas Kearne), \$2,000. The liabilities are about \$6,000.

Warrants have been issued at the instance of Felix Bresce and K. Skoel, by Police Magistrate Deacon, of Brockville, for the arrest of J. E. Brown, late treasurer of the township of Bastard and Burgess, on three charges of embezzlement of large sums of money, while acting in that capacity. Brown has fled and cannot be found. Bresce and Skoel are two of his bondsmen, against whom the township intends taking legal steps to make the defaulting treasurer's abattoir good.
