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Active preparations are now going on by Ottawa lumber firms for sending men to the woods. Gilmour & Hughson will largely increase their cut of logs, and will probably bring down more next spring than any of the firms now sawing in that district. J. R. Booth, Buell & Hardman, and the Bronsons & Weston Lumber Company have already sent up a large number of men and teams, and the outlook indicates a cut of logs above the average. There will be little or no timber made. There is a considerable quantity being held over at Quebec, and it is believed that it will be ample to meet all the demands next season. The lumber cut among the Ottawa mills is placed at 278,000,000 feet.

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The November statement of the C. P. R. shows gross earnings \$1,919,338, working expenses, \$1,103,700, net profits, \$815,638. In November, 1893, the net profits were \$917,314. For the eleven months, ending November 30, 1891, the figures are as follows: Gross earnings \$17,197,309; working expenses, \$11,362,443; net profits, \$5,834,866. For the eleven months, ending November 30, 1893, \$7,160,519. The decrease in net profit over the periods last year is, therefore, for November, \$101,636, and from January 1 to November 30 \$1,325,658.

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
