## BRITISH NEWS.

- London, Nov. 21.

VERY mail from the continent brings , intelligence of the great and increas-Ing military preparations throughout the dominions of his Pruffian Majefty; of magazines forming; of orders dispatched to the inspectors of different regiments in the provinces, to render them as complete as possible, and ready to act on the shortest notice; of troops marching to form cordons on the frontiers, and of every other circumstance that indicates the intention of entering into the disputes of Europe in a manner the most formidable.

From the valtness of the King of Prussia's military preparations, well informed politicians are more than ever convinced, that his aims extend far beyond the restoration of the Prince Bishop of Liege; and little doubt is now entertained, but that, in the enfuing spring, he will be opposed to the head of the Empire, though he now pays to much deference to the decrees of the Imperial chamber.
