PRAYERS

Mr. Blair, from the Standing Committee on Procedure and Organization, presented the Fifth Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Tuesday, May 4, 1971, your Committee recommends that, notwithstanding clause 3 of Bill C-241, An Act to amend the Prime Minister's Residence Act, the Government should consider the advisability of acquiring and maintaining a permanent residence for the Speaker of the House of Commons in the National Capital area.

Mr. Blair, from the Standing Committee on Procedure and Organization, presented the Sixth Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Tuesday, May 4, 1971, your Committee has considered Bill C-241, An Act to amend the Prime Minister's Residence Act, and has agreed to report it without amendment.

A copy of the relevant Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence (*Issue No. 3*) is tabled.

Mr. Guay (Lévis) for Mr. Goode, from the Standing Committee on Fisheries and Forestry, presented the First Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference dated Monday, April 5, 1971, your Committee completed its study of Bill S-11, An Act to provide for the obtaining of information respecting weather modification activities, and has agreed to report it with the following amendments:

Clause 4

Add immediately after sub-paragraph (ii) the following new sub-paragraph (iii):

(iii) the chemical nature, physical properties and quantities of any substances emitted into the atmosphere for the purposes of weather modification.

Clause 5

Delete Clause 5, and substitute the following therefor:

5. Any information obtained by the Administrator or his authorized representative pursuant to this Act shall be made public or made available on request to any member of the public.

The Committee has ordered a reprint of Bill S-11, as amended, for the use of the House of Commons.
