The operation of the compulsory attendance clauses of the School Law has helped to effect this improvement. In many of the school sections these clauses were carried out with the result. I am informed by both teachers and trustees, that children who had never attended before, were sent to school on account of the message delivered by the census taker. others for the same reason attended more regularly than they had done .before. T find there are many parents and trustees who do not clearly understand their duties and responsibilities in this matter. It would prove a simple and effective plan to have the sections of the Law and General Regulations relating to compulsory attendance printed on slips of paper, one of which might be left by the census taker at the house of every parent and guardian. Another cause, which has contributed perhaps even more to increase the, average attendance, is, that the teachers and public are becoming more keenly alive to the fact, that the large-

ness of the percentage of attendance is so often a fair criterion of the excellence and efficiency of the teacher. I have seen a teacher move from school to school, and have found every school he taught regularly and well attended; others again always have a small attendance compared with the number on the register. In the latter case one often hears a parent say: " I don't know why it is, but I cannot get my children to go to that teacher," in the former you will hear: "We cannot ksep the children at home." I have visited a school where all the pupils were present except two, but on the average I find about half of those present whose names are on the register. It hes to be considered that large scholars who attend during the winter only, remain enrolled during the year.
