

UNWORKABLE BILL SAY EMPLOYERS

Adoption of Draft Compensation Act Means Unnecessary Expense.

DEFINITE PROPOSALS

Canadian Manufacturers' Association Made Many Suggestions to Commissioner.

In view of the fragmentary character of the press reports of the hearing of the compensation bill on Thursday last, as which the draft bill prepared by the commissioner was considered, and in view of the possibility that these reports might create the impression that the association was opposing such a measure, the Canadian Manufacturers' Association desires the following statement to be made of their position:

Since the appointment of the commissioner, some three years ago, the Canadian Manufacturers' Association has made every effort to further the enquiry. It has, at considerable expense, brought experts from other jurisdictions, not in support of any particular interest of employers, but in order to profit by the experience of other countries and to secure a model act embodying the best results of this experience.

The result of the enquiry was that the representatives of the employers and those of the workmen had reached practical unanimity upon every question except the amount of compensation, which question would naturally be the subject of difference of opinion, and, perhaps, just as naturally, a subject for reasonable compromise.

The Real Issue. The real issue is not with the workmen, but with the employers' liability interests, supported by the C. P. R. and other railway companies, which at a late stage in the enquiry came forward with representations in opposition to the system which had been proposed, and in favor of a system in which employers would be individually liable and would be driven to seek protection by insuring in private companies.

The objection of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association and other organizations of employers of the province to the draft bill brought down is that in order to meet the views of the railway companies the bill has been so drafted as to render it unjust and oppressive to other classes of employers and immensely difficult, and, in fact, as employers are convinced, impossible of successful operation.

ESTABLISH BRANCH OF FRENCH FACTORY

The Oxy-Acetylene Company, a branch of a large Canadian concern making oxygen for cutting and welding steel, will establish a factory to employ fifty hands in the west end. The company has several sites in view, all with about 200 feet frontage.

SEVEN LOTS SOLD AT AUCTION SALE

USED GAS BOMBS TO CAPTURE A CRIMINAL

PARIS, March 23.—(Can. Press).—A weapon for the firing of asphyxiating bombs, devised after the recent siege of the automobile bandits in their strongholds, was used for the first time today in the capture of a negro, who had become suddenly mad and ran amuck in the Auteuil quarter, threatening everyone with a loaded revolver.

Detectives chased the man from room to room in a house where he had taken refuge, firing gas bombs as they went. The fugitive was finally cornered on the roof of the house in a state of semi-asphyxiation. He was quite powerless and was transferred to a hospital.
