DID THIS MAN MURDER RACHAEL FERGUSON?

James Ross, Said to Be Insane, is Now Under Arrest.

Two Boys Pointed Him Out as the Man Who Chased Them on Sully-Street.

AFTER MISS MOFFATT'S ASSAULT Police Get a Confession From the Prisoner Which, It is Alleged, Points to the Murder.

After three days' hard work on the case in which Miss Jennie Moffatt was the victim of a fiend's crime, Detective Porter of the St. Andrew's Market Division made an important arrest last night, and lodged his prisoner behind the bars at the Court-house station.
