Fairweakers: BENJAMIN CONSTANT DEAD

Passes Away in Paris, Aged 57.

Impressions BRILLIANT CAREER ENDED

Long List of Likenesses Includes Famous Men and Women of Two Hemispheres.

Paris, May 27 .- Jean Joseph Benjanin Constant, the painter, is dead. He was born in Paris in 1845. Brilliant Career Closed.

The fame of M. Constant's art was world wide. As a portrait painter he was popular in both hemispheres. In Firance he made his name as an "Orientalist," like Delacroix, Fortuny "Orientalist," like Delacroix, Fortuny and Regnault.

His parents had intended to educate him for the church or for the medical professions but he insisted on first attending the art schools of Toulouse. Here his talent showed itself from the start, and all plans of other vocations were abandoned.

M. Constant in 1865 entered the studio of Cabanel at the Ecole des Beaux Arts in Paris.

The artist's very first picture creat-

The artist's very first picture created a sensation at the salon—"Hamlet and the King"—in 1869. But it was his Morocco subjects that made him famous, as he was at once dramatic and daring in subject, powerful and rich in contour, a past master in drawing and always interesting as well as

ing and always interesting as well as artistic.

The list of his chief works includes:
"A Woman of the Riff Coast" in 1873.
"Prisoners in Morocco" and "Women of the Harem" in 1875, the great "Entrance of Mahomet II., Into Constantinople in 1443" in 1876, the portrait of his famous father-in-law, Emmanuel Arago (who would certainly have been President of the French Republic had he lived), in the same year, "The Last of the Rebels" in 1880, the much talked of "Cherifas" in 1884, "Justice in the Harem"—a gruesome scene, of which his beautiful studio, with its marble fountain, formed the mise-enscene, in 1885; then the great "Justinian," which just missed the medaille d'honneur of the salon in 1886; the pathetic picture of Beethoven playing his "Moonlight Sonata" in 1889, in which year the award of the gold medal crowned the official recognitions he had conquered.

Among the likenesses of men the most interesting are those of M. Chaplain, the great medalist; the painter's two sons, the younger being M. Andre, whose exquisite portrait, acquired by the government for the Luxembourg, obtained the high honor that was denied to "Justinian;" Lord Dufferin; the Duc d'Aumale; M. Maurel, the distinguished baritone.

Those of women include Mme. Benjamin-Constant! the Grand Duchess Paul of Mecklenburg, Mme. Calve, the einger; the Princess Radziwill, and, latest and most remarkable of all, Queen Victoria on her throne in the House of Lords. To this notable gathering of portraits should be added those of Sir Julian Pauncefote and the late Jay Gould, which M. Benjamin-Constant executed during one of his professional visits to the United States.
