HOARDED IN CHICAGO

Chicago, May 24.—Charges that millions of pounds of sugar were being hoarded in Chicago and that the sugar shortage could be ended if proper measures were taken, were made last night by Alderman Adamowski, chairman of the City Council Committee on the maintenance of the city food bureau.

"Carload after carload of sugar arrives here and nobody knows what it becomes of," he said. "If the council could take appropriation we will quickly be able to put an end to the hoarding."

MARKET ON CATTLE

HOLDS VERY STEADY

For a Holiday, the Run Was Fairly Heavy at Union Stock Yards.

With around 2,500 cattle on sale at the Union Yards yesterday, the market, despite the handicap of a national holiday, was steady with the closing prices of last week. There were some extra choice loads of cattle on sale, as the prices quoted well clearly indicate, constituting in some cases almost a record for carload loads.

Good and choice heavy weight butcher cattle were in good demand and breeders and feeders found ready sale at satisfactory prices. Altogether a good all-round market with a good average clean-up.

The Calf Market.
With around 100 calves on the market yesterday, all classes sold lower. Good choice veal sold from 14c to 16c; medium from 12c to 14c; and common from 10c to 12c. The market was a very steady trade.

Sheep and Lambs.
With a choice run of sheep and lambs, the choice wool sold from 12c to 15c, with the wool on. Clipped sheep sold from 10c to 12c, and cut sheep from 8c to 10c. There were a few spring lambs on the market, and a very steady trade in the sheep, especially the heavy fat ones.

The receipts of hogs, according to the official board, was 2750, with the market in a very unsettled condition. Buyers for the big plants stated yesterday that the market locally was out of line with the conditions obtaining elsewhere, and that they were working under a handicap. They would make no definite statement as to the prices likely to prevail during the week.
