HARD PROBLEM TO DUPLICATE PROBLEM TO DUPLICATE ROBERT FULTON'S STEAMBOAT

The building of a duplicate of Robert Fulton's steamboat. the Clermont, for the celebration next year of the discovery of the Hudson River has given the Memorial Committee in charge of the affair no end of trouble. To-day the members, including Naval Constructor Baxter and Rear-Admiral Coghlan, are not sure what the Clermont looked like, and they may never be.

Ever since the idea was first suggested there have been diverse opinions as to the shape of her hull. The data at Washington on the old boat give all but that, with the result that there are now two distinct interpretations of the records. The Smithsonian Institution idea is that the famous craft had a sharp bow and square stern, and the Hudson River Day Line officials claim that her stem and stern were both rounded.


