Fresh Selling at Opening is Cause of General Recession

Selling Pressure Affects Many Recognized Leaders—Recessions in Montreal

NEW YORK, Feb. 15.—Fresh selling broke out on the stock market with the resumption of trading today, causing a general recession of prices. Unusually over the government's suit against the National Food Products Corporation caused a three point break in National Dairy Products, one of the participating companies. Many of the recognized leaders also yielded to selling pressure, with clear losses of 1 to 3½ points registered by United States Steel, General Electric, American Can, Mack Trucks, American Smelting and Southern Railway.

MONTREAL, Feb. 15.—Profit taking on a fairly large scale tended to create an easier feeling on the Montreal Stock Exchange during the first half hour of trading this morning. Losses were general throughout a broad range with several of last week's leaders suffering large recessions.

Brazilian Traction came out with a week-end loss of ¾ at 92½. Consolidated Smelters was off 2½ at 22½. National Breweries eased ¾ at 64½. Montreal Power dropped a point at 221 and Lyall Construction was off ¾ at 36½. The papers were irregular. Brompton firmed ½ at 94½. Abitibi was off ¾ at 88 and Spanish River Pfd. was steady at 117½.

## Recalls "Fishing" of Jerry Cruncher

LONDON, Feb. 15.—"Resurrectionist" days are recalled by the discovery in an old Lillithgow churchyard of a cage, dated 1815, used for protecting coffins.

The "resurrectionists," or body-snatchers, were men who dug up coffins and stole the corpses from cemeteries to sell them to doctors and hospitals for surgical experiments. Robert Louis Stevenson wrote a short story which has immortalized this grim period of surgical history. Dickens also dealt with them in his Tale of Two Cities.

The cage found at Lillithgow was firmly embedded in the grave by 40 stanchions.

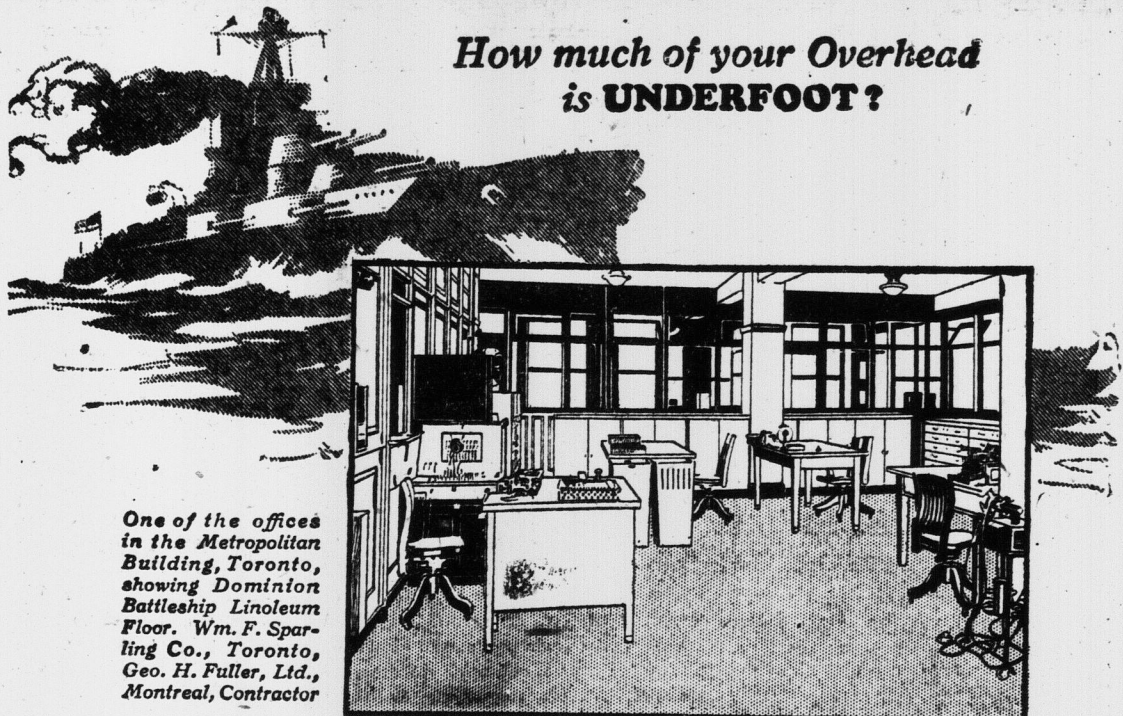
