





CHICAGO PLANS TO USE OIL. Industrial Plants Are Being Equipped With Necessary Burners.

Chicago, July 29 — Several Chicago industrial plants are preparing against a possible shortage of coal by hurriedly equipping furnaces and boilers with facilities for burning oil as fuel.
