RECENT DEATHS

The Late Charles Godfrey.

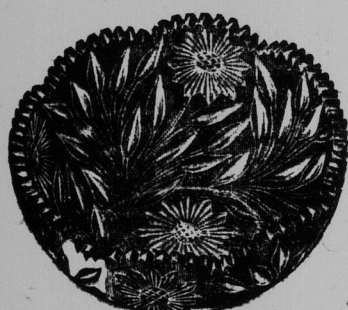
The Times reported the death of Charles Godfrey of Yarmouth in Boston, following an operation. He was seventy-two years old and one of Yarmouth's best known citizens, and had a very wide business career. He was the elder son of the late Rev. William and Susan B. Godfrey of Clements, Annapolis county, and went to Yarmouth about 1860. At that time he was employed with the dry goods firm of Vets and Daniels, but a few years after he established with T. R. S. Milden, now in the United States, the grocery firm of Godfrey and Milden. Later the firm was known as Godfrey Bros., and Mr. Godfrey was one of the firm until it went out of business several years ago. Mr. Godfrey had since carried on an insurance brokerage business, and for some years had been inspector for Nova Scotia of the London Guarantee and Accident Insurance Company. He is survived by wife, two daughters, Misses Susan and Lois, the former having been in London with her father; one brother, William, in Yarmouth, and one sister, Miss Sophie, of Annapolis Royal, now residing in Boston.

The death of George Robinson, youngest son of Elias and the late William Robinson, sr., occurred suddenly at Perry's Point, Kings county, on December 17, in the fortieth year of his age. Besides his wife and daughter, he leaves his mother, three brothers, and two sisters. The brothers are William, John and Albert, of Perry's Point. Mrs. Robinson, the former having been in London with her father; one brother, William, in Yarmouth, and one sister, Miss Sophie, of Annapolis Royal, now residing in Boston.

Guilford Appleby, of Grafton, died at the home of his daughter in Woodstock on Wednesday morning, aged 65 years. He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Herb Fleming, and one adopted son, Roy Appleby.

Hilbert Hampton, aged sixty years, died early yesterday morning in the General Public Hospital. He was a lodger in the rooming house at 78 Sewell street, which figured in the fire alarm yesterday morning, and while the fire was in progress was taken to the hospital, supposedly suffering from smoke suffocation. The cause of his death is given as pneumonia.

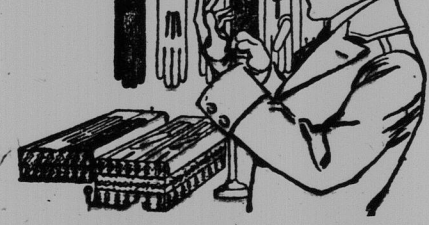

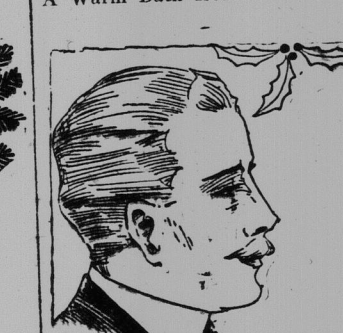

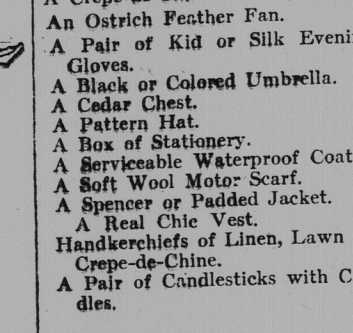
