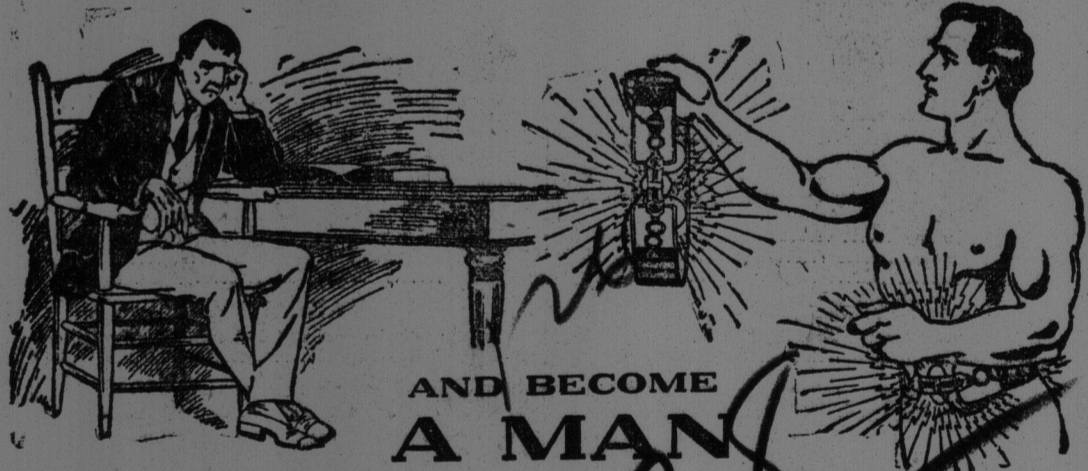

Morris Champion

Tulsa, Okla., Dec. 15.—"I am going to send a champion back to Oklahoma one of these days," is the way Billy Newman trainer of Carl Morris, writes of the fighting young locomotive engineer to Frank B. Ufer, his manager. Newman says it will not take more than six months longer at the rate Morris is assimilating the training he is now undergoing to put him in championship condition. Morris also works enthusiastically of his condition and prospects. He never has lost hope that the heavyweight championship of the world will some day be his.

Appendicitis Bothers Boxers

New York, Dec. 15.—What is the matter with all the champion boxers of late? Are they more subject to the ills, especially appendicitis, than the ordinary boxer, or does it just happen to be a coincidence that several of them are laid up at about the same time? Ad Wolpert, the lightweight champion of the world, is not the only champion who has the lightened since that Dave Smith, the Australian, Los Angeles, Sammy Kellar, a British 110-pounder, who claims the title in England, also recovering from appendicitis in London, having been operated on just on the eve of his battle with Sid Smith, for the championship. The French champion, Marcel Moreau, was also threatened with the same complaint, and it is not long since that Dave Smith, the Australian champion, was operated on; also Les O'Donnell, a crack middleweight of the Antilles, and Jack Richmond, a Michigan champion, were a bit out of it, but have fully recovered. It has been fortunate for most of the boxers, however, that they have been in good physical condition at the time of being stricken down, and that has helped wonderfully to pull them through safely.

Chattanooga, Tenn., Dec. 16—Joe Jeanette, of New York, won a decision over the Montreal champion, Al Wilson, in an eight round boxing match here last night. Jeanette had an advantage of over twenty pounds in weight. He had the better of the bout all the way.

Tulsa, N. Y., Dec. 16.—Batting Nelson and Bobby Wilson of the city, went off to slugging rounds before the Onida, county A. A. here last night. It was Nelson's fight though Wilson stood up to his opponent cleverly, the entire distance and made a good showing. Nelson landed more often and was especially effective in the fighting.

HARRY LAUDER SEES "SILLIER" SLIP AWAY

In England to Fulfill Old Contract at Less Than he Makes in States

London, Dec. 16.—Harry Lauder, the comic comedian, who arrived from America this week to fulfill a long-standing contract in the Christmas pantomime at the Lyric, is at a salary of a little more than \$800 a week, is like a bear with its head at having to return here.

"I am having no more pantomime engagements in this country after the present one," he said, "and I wouldn't have come from America now if I could have got out of it. I have paid \$15,000 to get off a pantomime engagement in 1912 as well as American. To my thinking they want to take everything and give nothing. When I'm ill they don't believe my doctor's certificate; but they must send down their own doctor to see if I'm not shamming."

"Some of them have made fortunes out of me, and yet if they pass me in the street or in the theatre they never say 'Good evening,' or 'How are you getting on?' or 'Pleased to see you.'"

"That is your English management for you! In America they trust you white and at having to return here. I've been getting \$2,750 a week there."

In England they think I'm making a lot of money out of them; but I'm making nothing.

"I have been away ten weeks from England to fulfill this American contract, and I had to pay the English management \$1,000 a week to allow me to get away, whereas when I'm here I get only \$800 a week. They thus get \$400 a week on me."

"If that isn't a scandalous state of affairs, I don't know what it is. Lauder is loud in his complaints of the action of English managers in keeping him to engagements made long ago, when he was just coming before the public as a star.
