

### SUPPRESS ILLICIT LIQUOR TRAFFIC

**Efforts of Mounted Police Doing Away With Moonshine from Canadian Border Towns.**

Windsor, Aug. 26.—That illicit stills have been practically eliminated from Canadian border municipalities as a result of the warfare waged against "moonshiners" by the Mounted Police, in charge of Sgt. A. Birtwistle, was asserted by Barrister William Egan, Federal Prosecutor here.

Heavy fines, in addition to jail terms in some cases, have had much to do with the success of the "Moonshiners," Mr. Egan said, in dealing with illicit distillers. How successful Mounted Police have been in their drive to wipe out "moonshiners" is shown by the number of stills that have been found abandoned at untenanted farms and on dump-heaps in the neighborhood of the urban districts. Co-operation by the city police was another factor, Mr. Egan says, in the results obtained during last winter, when as many as twenty stills, some of them of large capacity, were seized and broken up.

**COL. HAM'S JUBILEE.**  
Lt.-Col. George H. Ham, known in every part of Canada between Victoria and Charlottetown, was 75 years old yesterday. The author of "Reminiscences of a Raconteur" was in his office at the C. P. R. Windsor station and was congratulated by scores of old friends, who have always found Col. Ham the same genial, humorous, cheery good fellow. He was born at Trenton, Ont., in 1847, and is one of the oldest newspapermen in the Dominion. He "covered" the North-West Rebellion for the Toronto Mail, among other ventures. In 1891 he became advertising manager of the Canadian Pacific Railway and has, as Morgan's "Canadian Men and Women of the Time" puts it, "traveled extensively and is widely known."

Col. Ham last Saturday mailed a long article to the Manitoba Free Press, with a description of conditions in that city in 1870, when he worked there as a journalist. He is also busy writing further memoirs. His "Reminiscences of a Raconteur" were published on his 74th birthday.
