THIRD DAY, JAN. 21st.

The Synod re-assembled at ten o'clock a.m.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Bishop.

The minutes of yesterday were read and confirmed.

The Bishop referred to letters of apology from Rural Dean Naylor, Rural Dean Sanders, Rev. E. Wood, Rev. R. D. Mills, Rev. Rural Dean Brown, Rev. J. G. Baylis, Rev. Canon Ellegood, Rev. J. Roy, and Rev. G. Osborne Troop on account of illness.

Dr. Henderson having resigned his position as chairman of Education Committee, Archdeacon Lindsay was appointed to replace him.

Rev. F. Charters was appointed on the Committee of the Dunham Ladies' College.

The DEAN gave notice of motion, seconded by Rev. Canon MUSSEN, in reference to the temporary indisposition of Rev. Canon Empson.

Rev. Canon MUSSEN, seconded by the CHANCELLOR, gave notice of motion in reference to printing an obituary page in proceedings.

Rev. Canon DAVIDSON, seconded by the DEAN, gave notice of motion in reference to the illness of Rev. Canon Ellegood and prominent members of this Synod.

Archdeacon LINDSAY gave notice of motion in reference to the death of Rev. T. A. Young.

Rev. J. H. RENAUD gave notice of motion in reference to death of the Rev. R. Acton, late Immigration Chaplain.
