

Article I of the treaty shall conform to harbor regulations common to them and to fishing vessels of Canada or of Newfoundland. They

damages, when purchasing into the main body of the wharf, shall be liable for the cost for the purpose of purchasing wood or of obtaining water, except that any vessel, when discharging cargo, shall be exempt from such liability for a period of twenty-four hours, exclusive of Sundays and public holidays, within any such port or consignment, and shall be liable for the cost required to repair, when clear, and no vessel shall be excused therefrom for giving due notice of arrival.

They shall not be liable in any such bays or harbours for compulsory pilotage; nor when discharging cargo shall they be liable for damages, of purchasing wood or of obtaining water shall they be liable for harbor dues or other similar dues, but this exemption shall not permit either party to sue the other for any damages incurred by the libeltee reserved or secured by the convention of Oct. 20, 1915.

ARTICLE XV.—United States sailing vessels.—The sailing vessels of the harbours of the eastern and northwestern coasts of Canada, or of the coasts of Newfoundland, under stress of weather, shall be exempt from the laws of tonnage and pilotage, and shall, subject to customs laws and regulations, all fall on board when such un-

Judgments of forfeiture shall be final and shall be subject to review by the Council or the Governor-in-Council of Newfoundland before the same are executed.
