## SPORT

**GOLF:** Well-kept fairways, splendid turf greens and interesting hazards, provide opportunity for fine golf. No less attractive than the course itself is its ideal setting. From every fairway fresh beauties of the surrounding mountains are revealed, so that golfing here is especially delightful.

## SIDE TRIPS

### ● BEGBIE FALLS

A great, foaming cascade at the foot of magnificent, glacier-hung Mount Begbie. The park-like surroundings make of this the ideal spot for a summer's day.

### ● CANYON CREEK AND JORDAN RIVER

A carpet of pine needles for a path, luxuriant ferns and mosses, the grateful shade of tall evergreens, and a reckless torrent that rushes through canyons and over cliffs to join the Jordan.

### ● ARROW LAKES

A drive along the Columbia, with Sutherland Falls and other attractive haunts along the way.

### ● BIG BEND

As one travels now, in comfort, along the new Trans-Canada Highway into this Land of Romance, one journeys in imagination into the storied past. Up this same Columbia River came the gallant little "Forty-nine," bearing hardy adventurers to the ghost towns of Gold Rush days.

Here, too, is scenery of surpassing beauty. Roaring cataracts, picturesque canyons, noble peaks with shimmering glaciers, immense forests, and the great river in the valley below.

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
