By His Excellency Sir WALTER EDWARD DAVIDSON, Knight Commander of the Most Distin-

W. E. Davidson, Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Island of Newfoundland and its Depen

Whereas it is provided by Chapter 23, of 2 Elward VII, entitled 'An Act to amend the Post Office Act, 1891," that upon the recommendation of the Board appointed under the provisions of the said Ast, the Governor in Council shall, by Proslamation, give notice of any alteration of name, naming or renaming of places within this Colony, provided that Public Notice of such proposed alteration of name maming, or renaming of places shall have been given for three months

previoue: And whereas by Public Notice of date the 16th day of June, 1914, certain alterations of name and remaming of places within this Colony Country Rd., BAY ROBERTS were notified, as required by the above mentioned Act;

I do, therefore, by this my Proelamation, order and direct that the alterations of name and renaming of places within this Colony, as contained in the said Public Notice of the 16th day of June, 1914, shall come into effect from the date of these Presents, that is to say:-

1. Sibley's Cove, Placentia Bay, te be renamed "Prowseton." 2. Chance Harbor, near More-

be renamed "Bridgeport."

Chanceport. 4. Farmer's Arm, Dildo Run, Notre Dame Bay, to be renamed graphic Service in existence. "Summerford."

5. The Western section of Mortier Bay, extending from West's Point to Glendon, (including Butler's Cave), to be remained "O eston." 6. Piper's Hole, Piacentia Bay, to be renamed "Swift Current."





At the present outlook it would have been better to have kept the sum of \$500, which it cast, and given to some of the Tery heelers for a 'pleasure






