

THE PRINCE'S PRIZE.

Through the bounty of His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales, a prize will be annually offered for competition, called the "Prince's Prize," and consisting of an ornamental ink-stand, of the value of forty-eight dollars. This prize will be awarded to the Candidate for the Degree of B.A., who having been classed in Honors in at least two Departments, and in the first class in at least one Department, shall have obtained the highest aggregate number of marks in the subjects which are appointed for the examination of Candidates for the Degree of B.A., together with the additional subjects hereafter mentioned. In addition to the subjects appointed for the examination of Candidates for the Degree of B.A., the examiners in each department, or branch of a department, shall examine the Candidates for the Prince's Prize in one paper upon such books or subjects as formed part of the course in previous years, but are not included in the final examination.

Candidates for this prize are required to notify the Registrar of their intention to compete therefor, and to state specifically the subjects in which they will present themselves, at least four weeks before the commencement of the examinations.
