

GERMAN CASUALTIES ESTIMATED AT 2,822,079

DEATHS FROM AIR AND SEA RAIDS ON ENGLAND SINCE WAR BEGAN NUMBER 550

Total Killed or Injured 2,166—Number of Soldiers Only a Comparatively Small Fraction—German Army Casualties Since Start of War to May 1st. Almost Three Millions.

London, May 29 (4.01 p. m.)—In the attacks on the British Isles from sea and air during the war 2,166 persons have been killed or wounded. The number of deaths is 550.

The figures were given in the House of Commons today by Herbert L. Samuel, the home secretary, as follows:

In the three attacks from sea 61 men, 40 women and 40 children were killed, and 611 persons wounded. In the 44 air raids 222 men, 114 women and 73 children were killed, and 1,006 persons were injured.

The number of soldiers and sailors who were killed is only a comparatively small fraction of the total.

What War Has Cost Germany in Human Lives.

New York, May 29.—A news agency despatch from London says German losses to May 1 since the beginning of the war total 2,822,079, according to statistics published here. During April there were 91,162. The classified list of total casualties, including all German nationalities, but not including casualties of the navy and colonial troops, is as follows:

Killed and died of wounds—664,552; died of sickness, 41,325; prisoners, 137,793; missing, 197,094; severely wounded, 385,515; wounded, 264,827; slightly wounded, 1,023,212; wounded remaining with units, 117,956. Total, 2,822,079.

ATTEMPT TO SLAY AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN MINISTER TO PERSIA

Made by Djemel Bey, who was Involved in Assassination of Turkish Grand Vizier.

Berlin, May 29, by wireless to Sayville.—An unsuccessful attempt to assassinate the Austro-Hungarian minister to Persia is reported in a Constantinople despatch to the Overseas News Agency today. The attempt, according to the despatch, was made by Djemel Bey, who several years ago was involved in the assassination of Mahmud Scherif, Pasha, Turkish grand vizier and minister of war, and who, in consequence, was expelled from Turkey.

Edwin Samson Captured After Trawler, of Whose Crew He was a Member, was Sunk by Hun Airship.

St. John's, Nfld., May 29.—Governor Davidson announces that Edwin Samson, a naval reservist is a war prisoner in the hands of the Germans. He was a member of the crew of the armed trawler King Stephen, which was sunk and her crew captured by a German seaplane on Scarborough, England. This trawler, it may be remembered, left the crew of a German Zeppelin to sink in the North Sea on a previous voyage, fearing to take them aboard, as they outnumbered the trawler's own crew. The trawler was apparently taken into the admiralty's service after this.
