The members of the Junior Y.M.C.A. basketball team returned to the city on Saturday morning after a visit to Moncton, where they played two games with the Junior Y.M.C.A. of that city. While the local quintette lost both matches they gave the winners a hard tussle and their defeat was largely due to the heavy weight of their opponents which counts so materially in basketball. The local team lost the first game by a score of 26 to 15, but ran up 27 in the second game as against 31 for their opponents.

Regarding the second match the more interesting of the two, the transcript says: A battle royal took place this morning in the local Y.M.C.A. gym, when the Junior team from St. John Y.M.C.A. used terrific energy in their efforts to down the heavier Moncton team. Smarting from the defeat last night by the Junior Y.M.C.A. of Moncton the St. John boys came on the floor this morning looking for revenge.

But the heavier boys of our town weighed down on them and though the St. John team tried hard, it was impossible to keep their score as big as the local boys.

The game ended with score of 31 points for Moncton and 27 for St. John.

Each team played a steady game. The first half ended 14 points to 7, in favor of the Moncton team, and during the second period the visitors tried to overcome the small lead but the result ended as stated above.
