LIEUT. BENN WINS
MILITARY CROSS

Lieut. Jardine on Furlough—
Several North Shore Boys
Gassed or Wounded.

Newcastle, Nov. 1.—Lieut. Frederick
W. Benn, of Douglastown, son of Mr.
and Mrs. M. R. Benn, who went over-
seas with the 122nd Battalion, has won
the Military Cross.
Lieut. Arthur Jardine, of the Royal
Aviation Corps, who went overseas
with the 122nd, is home on furlough,
together with his wife, who was Miss
Pinkie Ingram, of Newcastle. Lieut.
Jardine is a son of Mr. and Mrs.
Charles Jardine, of Nordin.
Pte. Arthur Ashford of Newcastle
who is reported gassed, is a son of
the returned hero of the first world
war, Wm. Ashford, Jr., who returned
from France more than a year ago.
Pte. John Drummond, of Chaplin Is-
land, son of Hugh Drummond, has
been wounded. He went over with the
122nd and was transferred to the 104th.
M. Thomas and H. Maxime, two
popular Newcastle boys, are among
the recently wounded.
Gunner John Sterling Jardine, son of
Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Jardine, of New-
castle, is reported dangerously ill in
Kensington Park Hospital. He went over-
seas in a draft from the 66th.
Among the Canadian soldiers off for
Siberia is Charles T. Boyd, recently
teacher of Grade VIII. in Newcastle
Superior School.
Lieut. J. Wilkinson, who is an
English hospital with a broken leg, is
the grandson of Judge Wm. Wilkinson
of Chatham Head.

**FORMER BANDIT
KILLED IN WAR**
Boston, Nov. 1.—William Manogue,
alias William Clayton, a former bandit
who made daring raids on railroad
ticket offices in many cities in 1913 and
was paroled from the Massachusetts
State Prison so he could go to war, was
killed in action in France Oct. 13. Of-
ficials at the prison received word from
Ottawa that Manogue fell while fight-
ing with a Canadian unit.
Manogue was captured in Boston in
1913 after being chased through down-
town streets. He had held up
clerks in a Washington street ticket
office at bay while he ransacked the
 tills. When Manogue came to Boston
he was wanted for ticket office rob-
beries in Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Phila-
delphia and New York.
Manogue had served less than one
half of a ten-years' sentence when he
