**OTTAWA, May 14.**

The Grand Jury came into Court this morning and announced that they had found no bill against Annie McGinnis, charged with infanticide. Every one, including the police, has been trying to hunt her up, will be pleased that the matter is at last at rest.

**Breaking Windows.**  
Yesterday morning Mr. R. J. Patterson had one of his large plate glass windows broken by a stone fired by some unknown person. The stone, it is reported, came from the window of a house in Capt. Wm. Thomas that two Irish named John Yeomans and Wm. Good, were concerned in the act, he caused their arrest and the case was heard this morning. Capt. Thomas deposed to seeing some boys fire the stone which broke the window and thought the prisoners were the two who committed the act. As the identification was not positive, the boys were sent home, to appear when called for.

**Probable Marriage.**  
The English papers received by mail last night contain an announcement of a fashionable marriage at St. James' Church, following in London, on the 21st of April. The contracting parties were George Fortescue, Esq., of the British Museum, to Eliza, eldest daughter of the Rev. Wm. Black, incumbent of St. John's Church, Perth, and brother of George Black, Esq., of this city, Barrister at Law, Clerk of the Circuit, &c. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Frederick B. Black, brother of the Rev. Wm. Black, at the Archbishop of Canterbury. After the ceremony the guests, whose names given at length show a most fashionable gathering, partook of a collation in the residence of the bridegroom's father. The bride presents were numerous and elegant, the name of the Archbishop of Canterbury being first on the list of donors.

**After Annie.**  
Two or three days ago Policeman McLaren mysteriously disappeared from sight and speculation was busy as to his whereabouts. Some conjectured that he was on the look-out, disguised, for the assassin of Mr. Scammell, others concluded he had gone to Chicago for some of the forgers, while others again expressed their belief that he had got a clue to Annie McGinnis. The latter supposition was correct. The department had determined to find the escaped prisoner, and McLaren was chosen to carry out this mission at the residence of the fugitive to disguise himself by shaving his golden beard and effecting changes in his apparel, and none of his fellow passengers on the journey suspected that this spruce looking young man was an emissary of justice on the track of a fugitive charged with the commission of a crime of magnitude. As McLaren drew near the house he must have stopped to sigh in pity at the sorrow he would bring to the heart of the unfortunate young woman, who he struck dead, and the ones who had known her in her innocence as the happy Annie McGinnis. But remembering the charge of the Chief Justice, that sympathy should never interfere with duty, he pushed forward and made known his unpleasant errand. The father of gentle Annie was at home and showed McLaren through the house and

buildings therewith connected. McLaren saw the table where Annie had eaten her usual breakfast and rubbed her forehead and groaned at the sight of the remains of the chamber where she had slept the night of the incident, and he gazed out of the window where she had watched the sunrise from his bank of gold in the Eastern beys. He saw much to move his soul but he did not see the long lost Annie. She had been there, but had prudently taken her flight some time ago, and was believed to be in Prince Edward Island. He did not go to the Island after her, but concluded to return home and get further instructions. This morning it was understood by the press that the fact of his being on the spot was not to be published, as it was thought he might just catch the flighty Annie. As, however, no bill has been found by the Grand Jury, the interests of justice cannot be affected by the publication of the fact. So McLaren has lost his whiskers and his object of search, and the police force join gaily in the saying: "You will like a phantom, and now that all's over, we're glad that we've got rid of this."
