Gases in Shaft Set on Fire-Seven Miners Killed and Three

CLINTON, Ind., Jan. 14.—Seven lead and three injured miners, victims of an explosion, were taken from mine No. 7 here today. The search for the dead continued, but it is thought all have been taken out. Phere were two hundred miners at work in the mine when the explosion occurred. It is believed that a spark rom a miners lamp set fire to a keg of powder, and that the explosion set fire to the gases in the shaft.
