

when the question of Union was for the first time discussed by delegates from N. S. and N. B. with the Govt of Canada. He was also a delegate to the same city in 1862, to confer with the Govt. there respecting the construction of the Intercolonial Railway. Was a delegate to the Charlottetown Union Conference, 1864; and to that at Quebec in the same year; also to the London Conference of 1866-7, which completed the terms of Union. Sat in the Leg. Council, N. S., from 1847 until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—*Brunswick Place, Halifax, N. S.*

MCDONALD, *Hon.* Donald. L.

For many years in the service of the Canada Land Company. Is a director of the Royal Canadian Bank. Represented Tecumseth division in the Leg. Council, Can., from 1858 until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—*Toronto.*

McMASTER, *Hon.* William. L.

S. of the late Mr William MacMaster. Linen Merchant, of county Tyrone, North of Ireland. B. in 1811. Came to Can 1833. Is head of the firm of W. McMaster & Nephews, Dry Goods Merchants, Toronto. Is a mem of the Council of Public Instruction U. C., President and Director of the Freehold Permanent Building and Savings Society, and a Director of the Ontario Bank. Represented Midland division, in Leg. Coun-
