

Michael Tobin, in his lifetime a mem. of the L.C. of N.S. B. in Halifax, N.S., 1836. Ed. at Stoneyhurst College, Eng. M., 1868, Katharine, dau. of the late James F. Gray, Esq., Q.C. A commission merchant, and Danish Consul at Halifax. Has been a Commissioner of Public schools, and of the Poor; and a dir. of the Asylum for the Blind. Was a delegate to the International Convention, at Portland, Me., 1868, and presided over it during the latter part of the session. Sat in the City Council of Halifax for a lengthened period; was Mayor of the city, (twice elected by acclamation), from 1867 to 1870, and as such had the honor of receiving His Excellency Lord Lisgar, and H.R.H. Prince Arthur, the latter on his arrival on this continent. An unsuccessful candidate for Halifax in Local Assembly, at g.e., 1867. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at last g.e.
