An Act to amend the laws regulating the granting of Patents for Inventions.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the laws of this Province Prenmble concerning Patents for Inventions in this Province, by affording to those who may have obtained Patents, or to their assigns, more ample protection against those persons who might otherwise, in certain cases, 5 repeat their infringements of the rights of the Patentees; Therefore Her Majesty enacts as follows:

A latentee who has brought an aetion for infringement of Patent may demand security for all damages to be sustained by him from any repetition of such infringement,-otherwise an injunction may issue to command the defendant to abstain from such infringement, on pain of impri-
