The Standing Committee on Internal Economy and Contingent Accounts beg leave to make their Second Report, as follows :—

1. Your Committee recommend that the salary of the housekeeper of the Senate be \$1,000 per annum, with the residence in the Senate, and other privileges possessed by the late housekeeper.

2. Your Committee recommend that Mr. John Carleton be appointed housekeeper of the Senate in the place of Mr. Peter Dunne, deceased.

3. Your Committee recommend that Mr. John Dunne, acting housekeeper, be paid at the rate of \$1,300 per annum for the period during which he has discharged the duties of housekeeper.

4. Your Committee recommend that the salary of Mr. Frederick Gilbert, keeper of the newsroom, be increased from \$800 to \$850 per year.

5. Your Committee recommend that the salary of Mr. John Dunne, bank messenger, be increased from \$750 to \$850 a year.
