Govt. of Canada proud to be associated in complete equality with British Govt. in the prosecution of the war;

Gives me personally much ple sure to have this opportunity to express my own admiration, the admiration of my colleagues and the admiration of all Canada for the magnificent efforts of the free people of Britain directed by a government worthy of free men.
