The oldest of the belligerents in our common struggle against the tyranny of the Axis powers is the Republic of China. No mere words will add to the admiration which Canada shares with all the United Nations of the courage and tenacity with which China has maintained this unrelenting struggle. On fighting fronts in China proper there have been some gains. Considerable bodies of Chinese troops are being trained in India, against the day when they too may take up the offensive for the liberation of their own soil.

A treaty (will shortly be signed between China and Canada by which our country relinquishes any claims to extra-territorial status or treatment in China which might be implied from the previous treaties between China and Great Britain. This latter treaty, together with the corresponding treaties with the United States, have now (January 11, 1943) been replaced by new agreements which, in effect, erase the outworn concept of extra-territoriality which so long clouded the full status of the Chinese nation and people.
