"Sir, at C.I.T.C. A-12, C.A., I am Regimental Quarter-Master Sergeant. On 1st September 1943, the accused D-139132 Private Joseph Ernest Roger LÉPUT was paraded to the stores after his return, and the following recoveries were made by me viz:

Battle dress serge Trousers prs	1
Caps F.S.	1
Shirts khaki cotton w/l/s	1
Barces prs	1

The accused declined to cross-examine the witness.
