TICKETS

Are first-class, are good for 25 days from date of purchase, and permit of stopping both going and returning at all points on the Canadian Northern Railway, but destination must be reached within 15 days. Passengers may commence the return journey at any time, provided they reach original starting point within the 25 days round-trip limit of the ticket.

ROUTES

When purchasing tickets to Western Canada ask your ticket agent to route them **Canadian Northern**. By traveling over the Canadian Northern Railway, passengers have the option of various routes through Western Canada, and are enabled to travel 1,550 to 2,500 miles through the best farming country in Canada. Passengers for points north and west of Saskatoon and Warman can travel either via Brandon and Regina or via Dauphin and Humboldt. Passengers for Prince Albert can travel either via Regina and Saskatoon, via Dauphin and Warman or via Swan River and Meifort.

Passengers holding tickets to Edmonton may travel via Calgary, and tickets to Calgary will be honored via Edmonton without extra charge.

No exchange of tickets is necessary to travel either route, you simply board the train on the route you wish to take.

Liberal stop-over privileges are given holders of tickets reading Canadian Northern. On Homeseechers' tickets, stop-over within going limit of 15 days is allowed at any point in Canada.

Are on sale in the United States, reading via Duluth, and direct line through Fort Frances or through St. Paul, Duluth and Fort Frances or through St. Paul and Emerson.
