Refolved, That the Bill do país, and that the title be An Act for altering the time of holding the Court of Common Pleas, and General Sellions of the Peace, in the Counties of Annapolis, and King's County.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Council, and defire their concurrence to the fame.

Mr. Pyke reported from the Committee on the fubject of the Laws which are near expiring, and accordingly prefented a Bill to continue in force the feveral Acts therein mentioned, and the fame was read a first time.

Refelved, That the Bill be read a fecond time.

On motion, the Houfe refolved itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houfe, on the confideration of the Bill for regulating the exportation of Plaister of Paris.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Pyke took the Chair.

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee that they had gone through the faid Bill, and that the Committee had directed him to report the fame to the Houfe, without any amendment, and he afterwards delivered the Bill in at the Clerk's Table.

Ordered, That the Bill be engrossed.

Mr. Wilkins reported from the Committee appointed to examine the Public Accounts, and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it in at the Clerk's Table, where it was read, and is as follows :

That the Committee beg leave to flate that they have gone through the Accounts, and that they find them correct, fo far as relates to the general flatement, but further report that the balance of Thirteen Thoufand Six Hundred and Thirty-One Pounds, Nine Shillings and Eight Pence, which the Treafurer acknowledges to have in his hands to be accounted for, does not appear to be fatisfactorily accounted for—the Committee flate they applied to the Treafurer for an account of that fum, who informed the Committee that he would not render a particular account of the fame, but that he had money, or money worth, to the amount, which he will be ready to pay when called for; the Committee, therefore, beg leave to be advifed by the Houfe as to the paffing the faid Accounts.

Mr. Wilkins also delivered to the House a General Statement of the Accounts above mentioned, which were read by the Clerk, and are as follows :

Treasurer of the Province.

His Accounts have been received to 31ft October, properly flated, and all charges regularly vouched for; there appears a balance to be accounted for of £13,631

Collectors of Impost and Excise Halifax District.

Their Accounts to 30th September last have been received, are properly stated, and correct; there remained in their hands, as stated by them, Bonds, for collection, subject to the usual drawbacks on articles exported, to the amount of £11,161 7 0

It also appears by their Accounts, that, at that period, there were bonds in the Attorney-General's hands, and which are to be accounted for, amounting to 2,794 12 3
