Tuesday Evening, December 16, 1806. THE Houle met according to adjournment.

On Motion the Bill entitled "An Act to repeal an Act made and paff-"ed in the 41ft year of his prefent Majesty's Reign, entitled an Act for "the better Regulation of Elections, and to regulate Elections for Mem. "bers to serve in General Assembly in future," was taken into confideration, with the proposed amendments, which were agreed to....Ordered, That the same as amended be fent up to His Majesty's Council.

On Motion of Mr. Holland, Ordered, That the feveral Returns of Troops, Militia, Arms, and Ammunition, as are laid on the table by order of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor be now taken into confideration....Resolved, That from the above Returns it is neceffary that this House do addrefs his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, requesting him to make application to His Majesty's Ministers, in order to obtain a sufficient Force to be stationed in the Island for its defence, with a competent supply of Arms and Ammunition for the Militia of the Island, and that a Committee be appointed to prepare the same....Messive. Holland, Palmer, and M⁴ Aulay, were accordingly appointed, who having withdrawn returned and reported the same which was adopted.

On Motion Ordered, That Messrs. Holland, Palmer, and M'Aulay, be a Committee to wait upon His Excellency the Lt. Governor therewith.

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House to rezsume the Consideration of the Bill, entitled "An Act for ascertaining "laying out, and fixing the Lines and Boundaries of three Counties, and "of the different Townships into which this Island is divided, and for "more readily adjusting all differences between Parties, when it appears "that a fettlement or improvements have been made by mistake on one "Township for another, and also for raising by assessing out and fixing "the faid Boundary Lines."
