THE DEATH OF SIR RICHARD SCOTT.

The death in the eighty-eighth of his age of Sir Richard Scott moves a unique figure from public life. He was first elected to Canadian Legislature in 1857 since been more continuously a member of one great legislative body than any other of our time. He was not a brilliant debater, but he possessed many and worthy qualities and he had an unblemished and He had occupied portfolios of the Ontario and Dominion governments, and displayed qualities and thoroughness as head of departments entrusted to his late years he had been a member of the Senate.

Deceased was the author of the Scott Act and the Separate Act. He was knighted by Edward VII. in June of 1900.
