FAMOUS HOTEL BURNED

Fourth Storey to the Pavement Be-

New Orleans, April 30.—The imposing front of the St. Charles hotel, with its spacious porticos surmounted by a dome of majestic dimensions and classic archibetecture in the centre of the block, is all that is left standing of the most famous hostelry in the United States; within ownesse walls Jefferson Davis, Judah P. v. Benjamin and the other leading figures of the Confederacy formed the first plans for the establishment of a new republic betfore they started for Richmond; where no less than six congressional committees thave sat trying to solve what became drawn as the Louisiana question after the war, and where Presidents, Kings and optabilities from every nation on the face of the globe who have visited New Orleans

The fire, which raged within its walls all Satar-ay night, started in the kitchen. The flume at their way along the woodwork with amazing rapidity, and, owing to the inability of the firemen to get at them, it soon became manifest that their efforts would prove furile. The hundred or more guests had about all refired, and though many had been awakened the night clerk sent messengers to every room occupied, and thus there was no possibility of any of them having been cut off from escape, as the flames did not reach the main portion of the structure for fully haf an hour after the fire was discovered. Panic seized them, however, and they rushed about frantically, most of them in their night ciothes, and although there was ample opportunity to get down the rom throwing themselves from the second, hird and fourth storey windows.
