With the death of Mrs. Amelia C. Shadd Williamson, at the fam'ly home at 185 Church street Friday, 5th inst., there passed away a woman ante of an efficient chorus and novis to be the attraction at the Brisco

Special theatrical cars from Walfer was 76 years of age, was the widow of the late D. T. Williamson, who in the USs conducted a jewellery store on St. Paul street, where Foley's bakery is now located, and the mother of Mr. A. T. Shadd, the well-known jeweiler of this city.

When the family left St. Catharnes they moved to Western Ontario, and astriced at Chatham, going from there later to Washington, D. C., where they resided for a number of years. For the past six years she has resided with her son, Mr. A. T. Shadd, in this city.

For a number of years prior to the emancipation of the slaves in the United States, Mrs. Willamson was associate editor of the Provincial Freeman, a journal published in Toronoto in the interests of the free colored people of this country. Here brother, Mr. I. D. Shadd, was the editor, and the paper having sorved its purpose was discontinued shortly after 1867. Mrs. Willamson was by religion a Presbyterian. She was the only sarviving aunt of the paternal side of Dr. A. S. Shadd, of Melfort, Sask. Conservative candidate for the Saskatchewan Leg'slature at the last election.

Her husband predecessed her by sventeen years. She is survived by three sons, A. T. Shadd of this city, who is the third son, but who was adopted by his grandfather, Abraham D. Shadd of Raleigh Townshiph Rent Country, Ontario, from whom he received his name; I. J. Willamson and A. D. Willamson, and two dughters, Miss H. S. Willamson of Philadelphia, and Mrs. Amela C. Jackson, also of P
