



Excellent harvest weather during the first portion of the week enabl ed rapid advancement of all farm work according to the weekly crop report of the agricutural department of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Heavy rains towards the latter end, however, necessitated almost the entire suspension of operations throughout the west. The weather at present is mory settled. Wheat cutting is practic ally completed and coarser grains are just approaching that stage. Comparatively little threshing has b.en accomplished so far, but returns available reveal yields and grades generally exceeding earlier expectations. In some districts where crops were late, farmer fearing frost cut the wheat too green, which will of course; hurt the sample
