As we are now circumstanced, we have neither road nor security for the money advanced, and al-though the Shareholders should not ever receive one penny of the rent proposed to be reserved, yet taking this worst view of the matter, we cannot see that the this worst view of the matter, we cannot see that the interests of these Counties would suffer any additional injury to that already unhappily perpetrated, whilst by securing the construction of the road, we effect an immediate and permanent benefit more than adequate
