

AROUND THE CITY

LOCALS.

(From Monday's Bulletin.)
The funeral of the late Frank H. Corbett took place this morning to the Catholic cemetery. The deceased, who was 65 years of age, had been a resident of this district for many years, recently living near the Hallway House, between Edmonton and the Fort.

Work was started this morning by the contractor, W. J. Carter, on laying out the street railway on First street. The centre of the street is being ploughed up by the steam roller, similar to Jasper avenue. Only a few men are at work today but more will be put on later in the week.

The formal opening of the new east traffic bridge across the South Saskatchewan at Medicine Hat will take place on Tuesday, May 19th, Hon. A. C. Rutherford, premier of Alberta, will perform this ceremony. The other members of the cabinet of the Alberta government will be present to deliver addresses. Hon. Mr. Cross, who is at present at the Pacific coast, will return in time for this occasion.

A seven foot seam of excellent lignite coal at a depth of 375 feet, has been struck near Spruce Grove, centre on section 3, township 53, range 26. The property is owned by G. J. Wilbourn, of Winnipeg, and is being developed in charge of Mr. Gilmore, of Edmonton, have been in progress for some time. A company of Edmonton and Winnipeg capitalists are contemplating taking over the property and working the mine this summer.

A fine young apple tree in a garden owned by W. I. Crafts, Fourth street, recalls the fact that there still linger in Edmonton a tradition that apples cannot be successfully grown in this region. This is an unwarranted belief that accompanied early settlement of new districts and has been gradually outgrown in many portions of Canada. Mr. Crafts' tree, purchased last year from the Manitoba nursery, has had five feet of growth in the past year and gives every promise of a fruitful maturity.

The attorney general's department has notified the R. N. W. M. P. to strictly enforce the ordinance relating to public fires which have been frequently during the past few weeks. Yesterday two farmers living a few miles south of Strathcona were admonished by Inspector Worsley and each fined \$10 for neglecting to provide fire ladders and to extinguish fires. They plan not only to supply the local demand but to ship largely to outside points. H. E. Rogers, of Winnipeg, president of the company, is in the city this week looking into the affairs of the company and making preparations for the ensuing year's mining operations.
