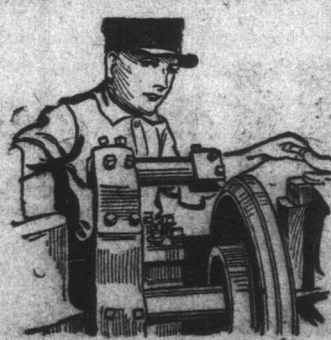

### Eye Strain Called Cause of Ills.

LAD TO OTHER REASONS.

"Many people suffer from eyestrain without being actually aware of it," says "U.B." writing in The Westminster Gazette. "They begin to frown when regarding an object, lines form under the eyes and round the corners, headaches, neuralgia, liver attacks become frequent. The sufferers fly to fashionable remedies for headache, neuralgia, liver, not realizing that the cause of all the trouble is eye-strain, and that it must be relieved before any cure can be effected."

"When the trouble has become deep-rooted, a visit to an optician is indispensable, but for slight eyestrain immediate relief may be obtained by the following practices: 'The moment there is a feeling of fatigue in the eyes close them, place the palms of the hands over the eyeballs, crossing the fingers above the eyebrows. With the hands held in that position, try and imagine a thick, velvety darkness. The strain will be instantly relieved. 'Another method is to fix the eyes on a very distant object, suddenly look at a pen or pencil held close to the face. This quick change of focus is most effective."

"A remarkably good eye poultice can be made from infused tea leaves. Make two small muslin bags of a size that will just fit over the eyes; fill them with the wet leaves, and, lying down with the head flat, place the bags over the eyes and leave them there for a quarter of an hour. A famous optician in the north of England declares that he cures the eye trouble of a good third of his patients by that simple method."

"Many people are troubled by small, gritty-like excrescences forming on the eyelids. These give rise to a great deal of pain and irritation. In a great many cases they arise from the simple reason that not sufficient water is drunk during the day. From eight to twelve glasses should be the daily measure of water for every adult. This flushing of the system

has a direct effect on the eyesight. 'It is a good thing to wash out the eyes daily with a good eye tonic. This can be done with a small eye bath, obtainable at any chemist's. A teaspoonful of common salt in a pint of boiled water makes an excellent wash."

### Ottawa Preparing for Busy Sports Season.

OTTAWA—Summer sport enthusiasts at the Capital are as busy as the proverbial bees. The summer sport season here is always a busy one, and the coming season promises to be no exception to the rule. One feature this year will be the absence of professional baseball, although, at the time of writing, it has not been definitely decided whether or not the franchise offered Ottawa in the Eastern Canada League will have to be forfeited on account of inability to get suitable playing grounds. Last year the Exhibition Park was available but the City Council has decided that the amateurs shall have preference for this year. Another feature is the determined attempt to bring lacrosse back into its own, senior, intermediate, junior and mid-level series are being organized. Bicycling will have a banner year, the big event in many seasons being the holding of the Dominion Championships here on Dominion Day. Track and field athletics are also due for increasing attention and already many devotees may be seen setting into shape for the season. Soccer football has always been popular here. Last year was a most successful one, but this year it is confidently expected that all attendance records will be broken. Last year 3,000 persons saw cup and league games.

Rowing enthusiasts have become excited about the announcement that Jim Ten Fyke, the famous Syracuse coach, may be brought here in the hope of gaining a long deferred championship for the capital. At any rate, Ottawa will be well represented in the Canadian Henley this year. Golf will hold its annual prominent place, but there is still much

disappointment at the absence of municipal golf links. It is contended that followers of the royal and ancient game would double in number if municipal links were established. Tennis players will have the opening of the new Ottawa Club courts in South Ottawa to interest them. This club bought many acres of land last year near the Rideau River, and hopes to inaugurate its new quarters with a prosperous season.

### Freak Legislation.

Freak legislation did not pay as prominent a row in the Kansas Legislative Session, just ended, as has been the custom heretofore. Several measures of this nature, however, furnished the legislators with occasional diversion.

One in particular, calling for automobile tags on front, rear and sides of cars, reached a stage where it was amended to include also tags on the top and bottom, before the enacting clause was stricken out. Some of the statesmen argued that the tag on top would aid the police in bandit chases, and every car should carry a tag on the under side so that a victim, when run down, may read the number of the license as the car passes over him."

A bill calling for a pension for farmers also elicited loud treatment. The original bill, introduced by a farmer, provided for pensions up to \$50 a month for both men and women, the minimum being \$10 a month for those residing on farms ten years; \$30 for twenty years, and \$50 for thirty years or more. One Senator, also a farmer, amended this to make the pension payable only to farmers "with corn on both hands and bunions on both feet." The measure was killed in the Senate Agricultural Committee. A Democratic representative presented a resolution endorsing Henry Ford for President, but the Republican majority of the State Affairs Committee remodelled it to read "Warren G. Harding." Instead of Ford, and recommended it for passage. —Acadian Recorder.
