

OTTAWA, May 30.—Negotiations between the Dominion government and the officials of the Grand Trunk Pacific for the transactions involvink the demolishing of the Hoyal North West Mounted Police Barracks in Culgary, and the erection on the site of a depot for the Grand Trunk Pacific; have been practically completed.

The negotiations have been carried on for the past year, with the government always in the position of demanding more than the Grand Trunk Profic people were willing to grant. Meantime, work on the bridge over the Bow river at Catgary, for an approach on the depot on the barracks site has been steadily going on, and the general sentiment has been that the railway people would finally arrive at a settlement which would be satisfactory

to the government.
