Redistribution Of the Districts

Soon to Come Into Force.

Much Additional and Timely Information for Provincial Electors.

The Redistribution Act of 1902, which takes effect on the dissolution of the present legislative assembly, contains much information additional to which was published yesterday, which is of particular interest at the present time as indicating to electors the procedure which is to be followed. Concluding sections of the Act are as follows:

"Forthwith after the coming into force of this Act. the registers of voters for the effectoral districts and ridings of electoral districts and ridings of electoral districts and ridings of electoral districts shall be cancelled, and the Lieut. Governor in Council shall appoint by person to be collector for each newly-constituted electoral district and it shall be the duty of the new collectors to be appointed in addition to the duties laid down in the Wabash Railway, states:
