MANY DEAD.

SUDBURY, Ont. Jan. 22.—The worst train wreck in the history of the C. P. R. occurred on their '800' branch at the bridge crossing the Spanish River at 1:10 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Spanish River is 28 miles from Sudbury, and is crossed by the C. P. R. with an iron bridge. Forty persons are now thought to be dead and twenty more injured.
