

JIM MORONEY'S MURDER.

JORDAN TELLS THE STORY OF THE CRIME.

A Demonstrative Crowd Gathers at the Inquest—Three Cheers for Policeman Vaughan—Successful Issue of Police.

The principal incident of conversation in the city throughout the whole of yesterday and last night was the murder of James Moroney in York street.

At 10.45 yesterday morning the prisoner was arraigned in the police court by the name of Charles Andrew, charged with the attempted murder of Alfred Cuddy, a policeman of the city of Toronto.

A Demonstrative Crowd. At the time the inquest was in progress the crowd outside the hotel increased till 9.30 there was a regular jam of people extending east and west on Pearl street.

The jury after a long deliberation returned a verdict of manslaughter. The coroner then adjourned the inquest till 11.30 tonight.

The police, however, thought that they meant something more, and a fresh detachment of men was sent for.
