

DESCRIPTION—"Roundish, conical, occasionally slightly compressed, rarely necked; medium to large; glossy bright crimson, not fading; ripens evenly; seeds small, compressed; calvx large, tenacious; flesh quite firm, salmon red, juicy; apparently a good shipper; flavor sub-acid, sprightly, with distinct aroma; quality good to very good, especially for canning; medium to late; a vigorous grower; foliage resistant to rust; an abundant plant bearer; blossoms imperfect; strong fruits talks; enormously productive."—Year Book.
