- (d) return transportation of children not resident with the member between the port of embarkation in Canada and the father's station in Ghana once during each tour, provided that any such child remains in Ghana for a minimum period of fourteen days; and
- (e) normal travel expenses applicable to the Canadian Forces travelling abroad to all passengers entitled to transportation under this paragraph.
- 69. All transportation under this Article by sea or air is to be by the most direct and most economical route subject to the availability of the passage required in accordance with the table set out in Schedule E.
 - 70. The Government of Canada agrees to provide:
 - (a) internal transportation within Canada consistent with paragraph
 68 for passengers entitled to transportation under that paragraph;
 and
 - (b) normal travel expenses as applicable to the Canadian Forces for travel within Canada.

Article XXV (Baggage Allowance)

- 71. The Government of Ghana agrees to provide to each member and his family entitled to transportation under Article XXIV a baggage allowance as follows:
- (a) sea travel—free conveyance by sea of personal baggage of up to three shipping tons for each adult passenger and one shipping ton for each child;
- (b) air travel
- (i) free conveyance by air of personal baggage as appropriate for the class of air travel and, in addition, 100 pounds per adult passenger by air freight, and
 - (ii) when a member travels by air, transportation by sea of unaccompanied baggage at the rate of three shipping tons per adult passenger and one shipping ton per child; and
 - (c) free conveyance of baggage within Ghana.
- 72. The Government of Ghana agrees that all or part of the baggage allowances under this Article may be commuted for a cash payment to the member towards the shipment of one motor vehicle.

Article XXVI (Accommodation)

- 73. The Government of Ghana agrees that married quarters will be allotted to members entitled to such accommodation in accordance with the Armed Forces of Ghana points system in force at the time with the exception of members who are
- (a) medical officers; or
- (b) serving at the Ghana Military Academy as academic instructors who will be accommodated under special arrangements.
- 74. The Government of Ghana agrees to provide married quarters which will be partly furnished in accordance with scales of the Armed Forces of Ghana to include hard furniture, refrigerator, carpets, gas or electric cooker, fans, water heaters and standard and table lamps to those members entitled to married quarters.
