11.35 a.m. The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh accompanied by the Hon. Howard C. Green (Minister of Public Works) arrive at south entrance of Deas Island Tunnel.

The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh alight from their automobile and are received by the Premier of British Columbia (Hon. W. A. C. Bennett) and Mrs. Bennett.

Mr. Bennett presents the Minister of Highways (Hon. P. A. Gaglardi) and Mrs. Gaglardi and the Reeves of the Districts of Delta (J. W. Kirkland, Esquire) and Richmond (J. Stolberg, Esquire) and their wives.

11.40 a.m. The Minister of Highways presents some of the men responsible for designing and constructing the Tunnel.

11.45 a.m. The Premier speaks briefly and requests Her Majesty to cut a ribbon thereby formally opening the Deas Island Tunnel.

The Premier of British Columbia and Mrs. Bennett, and Mr. and Mrs. Gaglardi take leave of Her Majesty.

11.55 a.m. The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh enter an automobile and drive through the Tunnel.
