EXCELLENCY,

I have the honour to refer to the Notes exchanged at Ottawa on January 3 and 16, 1951*, in terms of which it was agreed to suspend, until December 31, 1951, the margins of preference on unmanufactured logs, classified under Union tariff sub-items 279 (a) (i) and (ii), which are guaranteed to Canada by virtue of the Trade Agreement of 1932 between the Governments of the Union of South Africa and Canada.

I now acknowledge receipt of your Note No. T. 9/7/3 of January 2, 1952, and have the honour to inform you that the Government of Canada accepts the proposal of the Government of the Union of South Africa that the margins of preference on unmanufactured logs be suspended for a further period, on the understanding—

(See Note I)

“(a) that such temporary South Africa.”

The Government of Canada agrees that your Note of January 2, 1952 and this reply shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between our two Governments with effect from January 1, 1952.
